### SYNOPSIS

The following information is a preliminary summary of an incident where a motor vehicle accident (MVA) resulted with a vehicle into a business and a subsequent explosion where several firefighters were hit with shrapnel and resulted in a significant near miss event. No injuries occurred.

### NARRATIVE

At 2215 on 7/5/2025, several vehicles were involved in an MVA on 13400 South and 5200 West, pushing one of the vehicles into the Domino's Pizza business. Following an initial arrival and prioritization of resources, one fire company was starting suppression efforts while another fire company had just completed a primary search of the bravo exposure neighboring business. An additional company was preparing to make entry into the delta exposure neighboring business when gas that had collected in the building from an unknown source resulted in an explosion which lifted the roof from the building and pushed the brick façade of the building on both the alpha and charlie side of the structure. The walls were knocked down nearly twenty feet out in both directions and additional debris was blown over fifty feet into the street. The brick façade walls nearly fell atop several of the firefighters, as well as flying debris hitting several firefighters. The incident didn't result in any reported injuries, but did result in significant close calls.

The Blue Sheet is a brief summary report of any event that meets or exceeds a pre-determined threshold and is intended to provide factual information created within 24-hours and distributed to UFA personnel within 48-hours of the event. To that end, it is published and distributed to improve situational and safety awareness. Information contained within may be subject to revision as further investigation is conducted, and other reports and/or documents are received. A Blue Sheet may warrant a Safety Stand Down for dissemination of the information to assigned personnel.

## **RECOMMENDATIONS FOR REVIEW**

Although this was a dynamic and rapidly evolving situation and as of this time doesn't result in identified recommendations based on the response, it is recommended for crews to review collapse zones and associated policies, including:
